ACTING PROFESSORSHIP FOR SIGN LANGUAGES AND SIGN LANGUAGE INTERPRETING

The position commences on 01.04.2021. This is a fixed-term contract in accordance with the German part-time and fixed-term contract act (Gesetz über Teilzeitarbeit und befristete Arbeitsverträge, TzBfG). The contract period is until the end of the maternity leave, expected 28th of January 2022. The position calls for 100% of standard work hours per week.* This position is also suitable for part time employment.

SPECIFIC DUTIES:

The successful candidate is expected to teach and conduct research in the field named above. The teaching hours correspond to those required of the professorship to be temporarily filled, which is 9 teaching hours (LVS). Helpful are very good scientific skills and international competences, as well as excellent teaching experience. The acting professor will have access to staff and an existing material budget as well as resources for tutorials and proofreading assistance after consultation.

REQUIREMENTS:

Academic qualifications and additional requirements as specified in Section 15 of the Hamburg higher education act (Hamburgisches Hochschulgesetz, HmbHG) apply.

ADDITIONAL CRITERIA:

The successful applicant is expected to have international research experience. The University places particular emphasis on the quality of teaching and therefore requests applicants to provide details of their teaching experience and objectives.

* Full-time positions currently comprise 39 hours per week.

The University aims to increase the number of women in research and teaching and explicitly encourages qualified women to apply. Equally qualified female applicants will receive preference in accordance with the Hamburg act on gender equality (Hamburgisches Gleichstellungsgesetz, HmbGleiG).

Qualified disabled candidates or applicants with equivalent status receive preference in the application process.
