The semester hours per week of teaching are 4.5 course hours (part-time 3.5 course hours). Very good scientific, internationally visible achievements as well as excellent pedagogical qualities with relevant teaching experience are advantageous. The post holder is expected to represent the Institute in teaching and research.
