Life stories of elderly deaf people

- Project at the University of Göttingen and University of Hamburg since 2016
- Funding by Horizon 2020 and Pro*Nieder-Sachsen
- Göttingen team: Jens-Michael Cramer, Jana Hosemann, Sina Proske, Markus Steinhach
- Documentation of life stories of deaf people born between 1930–1950
- Interviews of about 50 Deaf people in Germany
- Unique socio-cultural, historical, and linguistic cultural heritage
- Student's exhibition designed and prepared in a seminar at the University of Göttingen
- Sub-project of the EU Sign-Hub project
